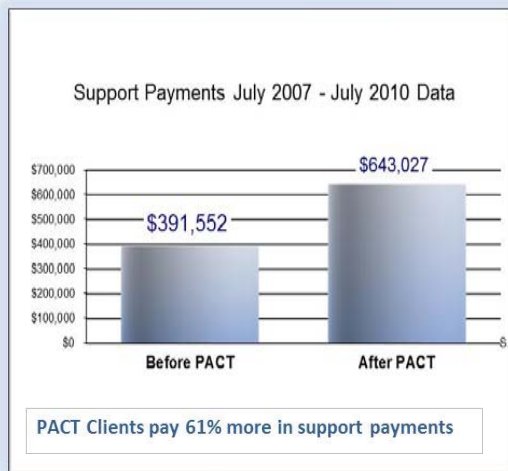


PACT Facts

For Your Information:

- The **PACT Program** began in 1997.
- 395 parents were referred to the **PACT** class July, 2007 - June, 2010.
- 293 parents completed the **PACT** class July, 2007 – June 2010.
- \$643,000 was paid in the 12 months following **PACT** attendance 2007 through 2010.
- Payments increased by **61%** following completion of the class.
- The most frequently asked question by **PACT** attendees: “Why didn’t we know about this class sooner?”



PACT Parents Are Consistently There

Program Objectives:

- Increase frequency of child support payments by non-custodial parent
- Provide parents with the practical tools needed to organize thoughts and questions about child support, organize paperwork, work within a budget, and pay their monthly obligation.
- Educate parents regarding Support Enforcement (what their enforcement office can and cannot assist them with).
- Improve commitment and awareness of support issues which are integral to parenting.
- Provide information and referrals to outside resources including legal resources, job skills training, and social services which include food, shelter, and health care.
- Increase participants sense of self-worth and their importance to others.
